


- No university college




Without a paid job

- 2008 2011: Tried some jobs
- No science degree
- Factory for people with disabilities
- Tech / development in after hours
- Ended on a sickness benefit

Autistic logic & Developers logic




Developers Logic

A Boolean is true or false

It's good to declare variables, what type it's expected

If you program a loop, the exit scenario should be clear

It's very structured



Autistic Logic

A fact is only true or false

It's very nice that every circumstance is declared If there's a path to follow, auti's like it's clear and clean

Most of them are very structured

The Autist' Brain





Theory of Mind

- Understanding the WHY
- Seeing which behavior causes which outcome
- Seeing logical steps

Executive Functioning

- Everything that you need in daily living or in a working environment
- Examples:
 - Planning a timeslot
 - Planning what to wear at a conference, meeting
 - Planning which sessions, you want to see



Central Coherence

- Coherence of situations, things, tasks, words
- Seeing the global picture

Context Blindness

- Understanding the context of something
- 'One incentive has one meaning'
- Problems with 'use of the same words' for other meanings

Sensory deficiencies

- Sensory Overload
- The need for additional sensory stimulation
- Sensory deficiencies can cause difficulties at the job

Extra: STRESS!
Anxiety!
Depression!
ADHD! (Mental Health)

- Additional Mental Health conditions
- Can trigger more difficulties
- Can trigger 'Being more autistic' →
 At least behaving more different

Basic solution

- Explaining, Explaining & Explaining
- Trying to understand
- Trying to figure out
- Trying to Adjust

Autism / ASD: Disability or Neurodiversity?

- Thought leadership on autism changed
- People with autism / Asperger's are superpowers
- Good for inclusion
- People with autism need to know their self very good
- Example: Greta Thunberg




Paid job or volunteer job?

- People with autism think straight forward
 - My way of the highway
 - Can be sure they use the best classes, procedures
- Difficult to change code style
 - New possibilities with new versions
 - Difficult to adapt some patterns.


Structure

Being fanatic & user groups and conferences

- Can be an issue
- More difficult at conferences
 - Variety of topics / speakers



User groups & conferences and different communication

- Talking too much or too little
- Problems with eye contact
- Different non-verbal communication
 - Example: being excited but can't show

Being fanatic in tech

- Pro Microsoft / Apple / Linux?
 - Difficult to use both
 - C# / Java / C++
 - ASP.NET or PHP
 - Biased in apps / libraries



- Time in specific nice side project



 - People talking



- Meltdowns




Smell & Food

- Being afraid to use public transport (too little time in the community)
- Cloud changes
- Being afraid of losing friends & Being fanatic
- Afraid of losing your job
 & own vision

Example: Moving from Azure laaS to PaaS



Customers and Separation Anxiety

- Stress & Anxiety with:
 - Customer demands
 - Pricing (asking too little)
 - Borders & Limits by specific questions



DEADlines

- Afraid for not getting the deadline.
- Working even slower due to the stress






